#### Position Summary:

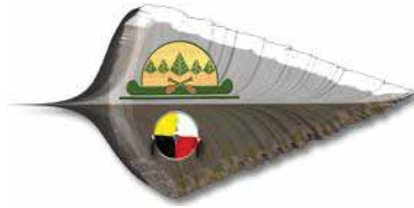

# Career as a Fishery Officer

## FISHERY OFFICER DUTIES

To enforce the Fisheries Act and other related Acts and Regulations; to protect the fishery resources and the fish habitat by doing patrols on land, by sea and air; to participate in public education and awareness programs to develop a greater awareness of the fishery resources and habitat protection.

### Experience

Candidates must demonstrate experience in one of the following areas:

- **Renewable/Natural Resources and/or Habitat Management:** Experience in activities pertaining to resource utilisation, field research or field assessment of a renewable resource, such as Fish, Wildlife, Forest, etc.
- **Enforcement:** Experience in enforcement of legislation or by-laws with a law enforcement agency or a security agency.
- **Outdoor Field Services:** Field experience in providing outdoor services to fishers, hunters, or eco-tourists. (e.g. Guiding Services)
- **Fishing Industry:** Experience in commercial, aboriginal, or recreational fisheries, or in a related field (does not include recreational fishing for personal use).

## POSITION REQUIREMENTS

### Education

Successful completion of 2 years of an acceptable post-secondary educational program in a field related to the duties of the position or an acceptable combination of education, training and/or experience.

### Official Languages Proficiency:

Official language requirements vary according to regional needs.





## CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

- Successful completion of the departmental Fishery Officer Career Progression Program (FOCPP) classroom training;
- Deployment to any part of the country, or assignment to all types of enforcement activities such as inland, coastal and offshore patrols (including air patrols), and/or forensic accounting and/or special operations;
- Meet medical and psychological suitability standards;
- Possession of a valid driver's licence, a current standard First Aid Certificate and a CPR Certificate;
- Carry and use firearms and other restricted and prohibited weapons;
- Meet the DFO use of force proficiency standards;
- Wear a uniform and required protective clothing;
- Work and/or travel at sea or by air and in a variety of terrains and degrees of isolation for various periods of time in all weather conditions;
- Reliability and Security: Secret

## TRAINING PROGRAM

Successful candidates are initially recruited as Cadets and progress from GT-02 to the GT-04 group and level contingent upon successful classroom and field training. Training is for a duration of approximately 36 months through the departmental "Fishery Officer Career Progression Program" (FOCPP).

The FOCPP classroom training portion is approximately 18 weeks. Skills are acquired in areas such as fish identification, conducting patrols, communication, negotiation and enforcement methods in support of the Department's mandate to conserve and protect fisheries resources. The training is delivered in government facilities such as the Coast Guard College in Sydney, N.S. The last 10 weeks of the training is delivered at the R.C.M.P. Academy in Regina, SK. Successful completion of the Physical Ability Requirement Evaluation (PARE) is mandatory to attend the FOCPP training.

## TRAINING ALLOWANCE AND

### SALARY

Cadets receive a training allowance of \$350 per week for the duration of the classroom training. Standard deductions and \$90 per week for room and board. Upon successful completion of the classroom training, cadets are appointed to a GT-02 Fishery Officer position and have to successfully go through 30 months of field training in order to be appointed to a GT-04 position.

FOCPP is a training program having a three-level classification structure (GT-02 to GT-04).

Salary range from \$47,005 to \$67,340.

All Fishery Officer positions are advertised via the Public Service Commission at jobs-emplois.gc.ca.

## SNOW REMOVAL: DRIVEWAYS

There have been a lot of questions, concerns and comments on social media and in the Community after the last storm, so we thought we should provide some additional information for people to better understand the process. As of right now, we have over 300 driveways that we plow, in addition to the streets and the parking lots (school, health centre). Our primary concern is keeping the streets plowed and safe. Plowing driveways does NOT occur prior to the end of the storm. When the storm is over, that's when driveways begin to be plowed. The policy has always been "Seniors First". We have a list of all seniors (age 60+) that is provided to all our drivers. One truck is instructed to start at the bottom of the reserve and work up, and one at the top and work down. There are over 80 seniors' driveways, plus the seniors' complexes on Paul Street and Maliseet Drive. Once these driveways are done, then the plowing of the other driveways is to start. So, if you see a truck that appears to be skipping from one driveway to another, this could be the reason why. There is no other priority of homes, so if you anticipate a storm, and have commitments you need to leave your home for the next day, you may want to make other arrangements (other than waiting for our operators to plow your driveway) to ensure you are able to get out of your driveway after the storm.

CPW are not generally responsible for sanding and salting driveways. However, in the event of a storm with a lot of ice accumulation, they will make best efforts to sand driveways, with seniors taking priority. Community members are free to go get sand from the Depot for their own personal use on their driveways. This is the responsibility of the Community member, not the responsibility of CPW to deliver the sand.

We need the Community's full cooperation when it comes to moving vehicles from the driveway to allow for plowing. It is very difficult to plow around a vehicle. Sometimes, the plowing cannot be done at all if there isn't sufficient room to put the snow. If the operators feel they cannot safely remove the snow with little chance of damaging a vehicle, they will not plow. It is the home occupant's responsibility to move their vehicle(s) for the operator to effectively and safely remove the snow. It is also not the operators' responsibility to go back to driveways to plow after a vehicle is moved. That is why it is important to move the vehicle while they are there.

We thank you for your patience and understanding with this matter.

### PARKING BAN

The previous notice stated that vehicles were to be removed from the roadway during and after a storm. This has caused some challenges as there are often times when snow removal is carried out for other reasons, ie. widening streets, pushing back corners/banks. As a result, there will be a complete **PARKING BAN** on all streets, until April 1, 2018. Vehicles that are not removed may be towed, at the owner's expense. If you have vehicles that require a place to be parked and cannot be parked on your property, please contact that band hall and we will try to assist with making arrangements.

### REMINDER: OVERNIGHT PARKING

Please be advised that there is to be absolutely **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING** at the Culture Centre parking lot. Vehicles that are not removed may be towed, at the owner's expense. Again, if you need to park somewhere, please contact that band hall and we will try to assist with making arrangements.
