## **SNOW REMOVAL FOR COMMUNITY MEMBERS**

St. Mary's provides snow removal (plowing) for all seniors (60+) on reserve. However, there is only one plow truck and over 70 driveways that are required to be plowed. We would ask for your understanding and patience for all driveways to be cleared. Also, in order for driveways to be completely cleared, any vehicles have to be moved from the driveway onto the street until the plowing is finished. If vehicles are not moved, the driveway cannot be completely plowed. Also, please note that plowing does not start until the end of snowstorm. Seniors have first priority when it comes to snow removal.

All other driveways on reserve (for non-seniors) are also plowed, however, there is only 1 machine to do all the driveways. This does cause a delay due to the amount of time involved to clear everyone's. Also, if there is a heavy snowfall, this will increase the time to plow each driveway. In addition, if people want their driveway fully cleared, they are responsible for moving their car onto the road while their driveway is being plowed.

It would be very helpful to the snow removal operators to place reflectors or some sort of marker on fences or other structures that may be difficult to see. If the operator cannot see something because it is covered in snow, they will not know it is there.

We are aware and understand that some community members do not want to wait to be plowed and hire someone else to clear their driveway. If you do NOT want CPW (public works) to plow your driveway, please call the band hall and leave your name and address.

Training and education of First Nation youths/community members in gathering  
Aboriginal Traditional Knowledge (ATK) in ethically and culturally appropriate manner

Maliseet Nation Conservation Council (MNCC) is conducting a training workshop in Fredericton during the period 25 – 28 February 2013 for Aboriginal Traditional Knowledge (ATK) technicians in Maliseet communities in New Brunswick. The participants will be trained in ethical gathering of traditional knowledge including recording of interviews, data processing, storage and designing traditional knowledge questionnaires during the workshop. ATK has been formally recognized by the government of Canada as important piece of information and it is currently being effectively used for conservation of Species at Risk (SAR). In future most government and private sector development projects that could potentially impact First Nation lands/sacred sites will be required to take traditional knowledge into consideration (in addition to the western science) to evaluate impact on above sites due to development activities. As such there will be great scope for trained ATK technicians not only in New Brunswick but also in other parts of Canada. This is a good opportunity for the people who are willing to develop their career as ATK practitioners to strengthen their capacity. MNCC can train up to 5 people from each Maliseet community in New Brunswick. I appreciate if you could nominate suitable candidates from your community to participate at the workshop. MNCC will pay travel and accommodation for participants. Please make necessary arrangements to send nominations from your community to MNCC's Executive Assistant, Georgina Craig on or before January 15, 2013 in order for us to make necessary arrangements with regard to their travel and accommodation.
