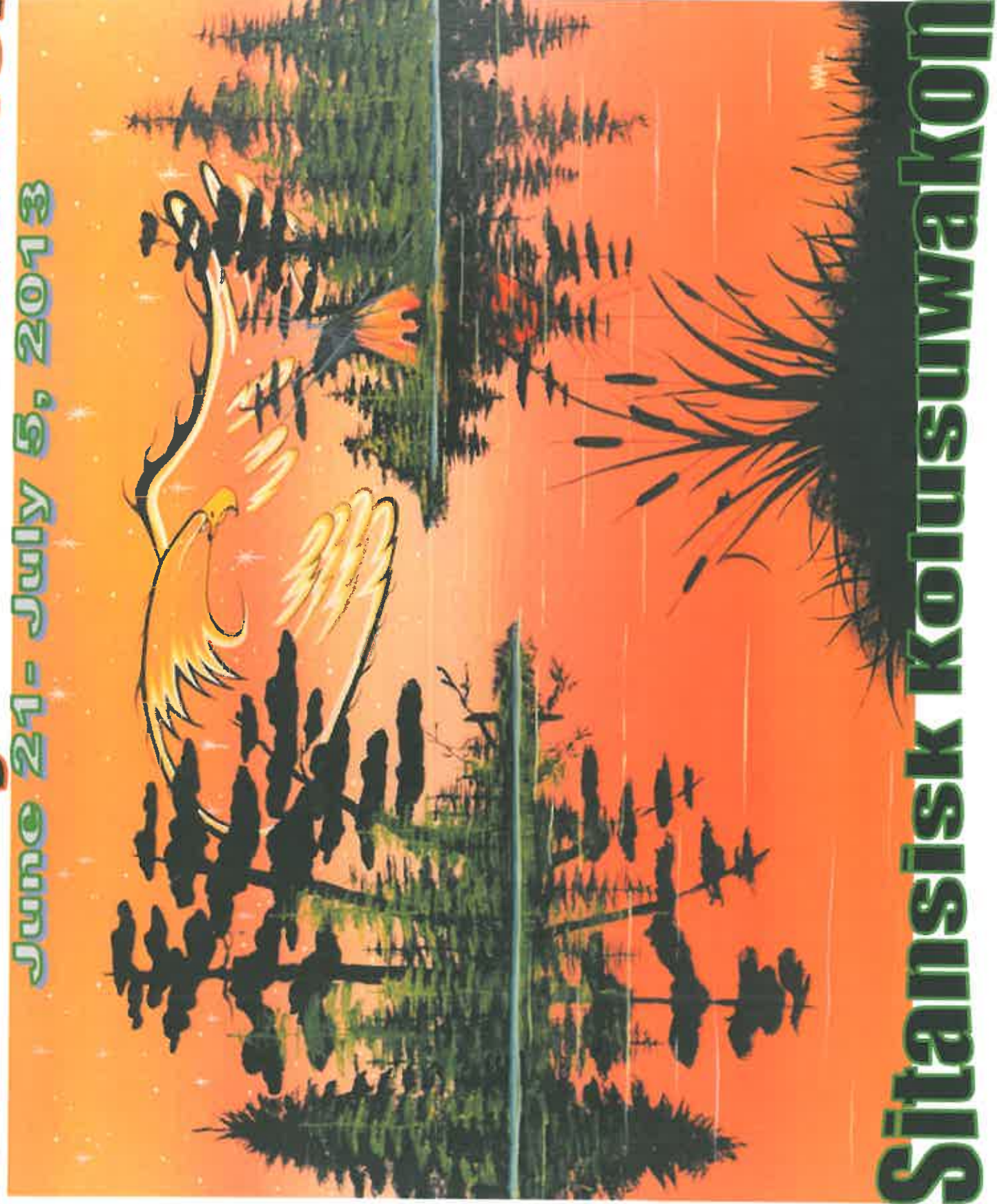

We will keep you advised of future developments in our recruitment of a full-time physician for St. Mary's.

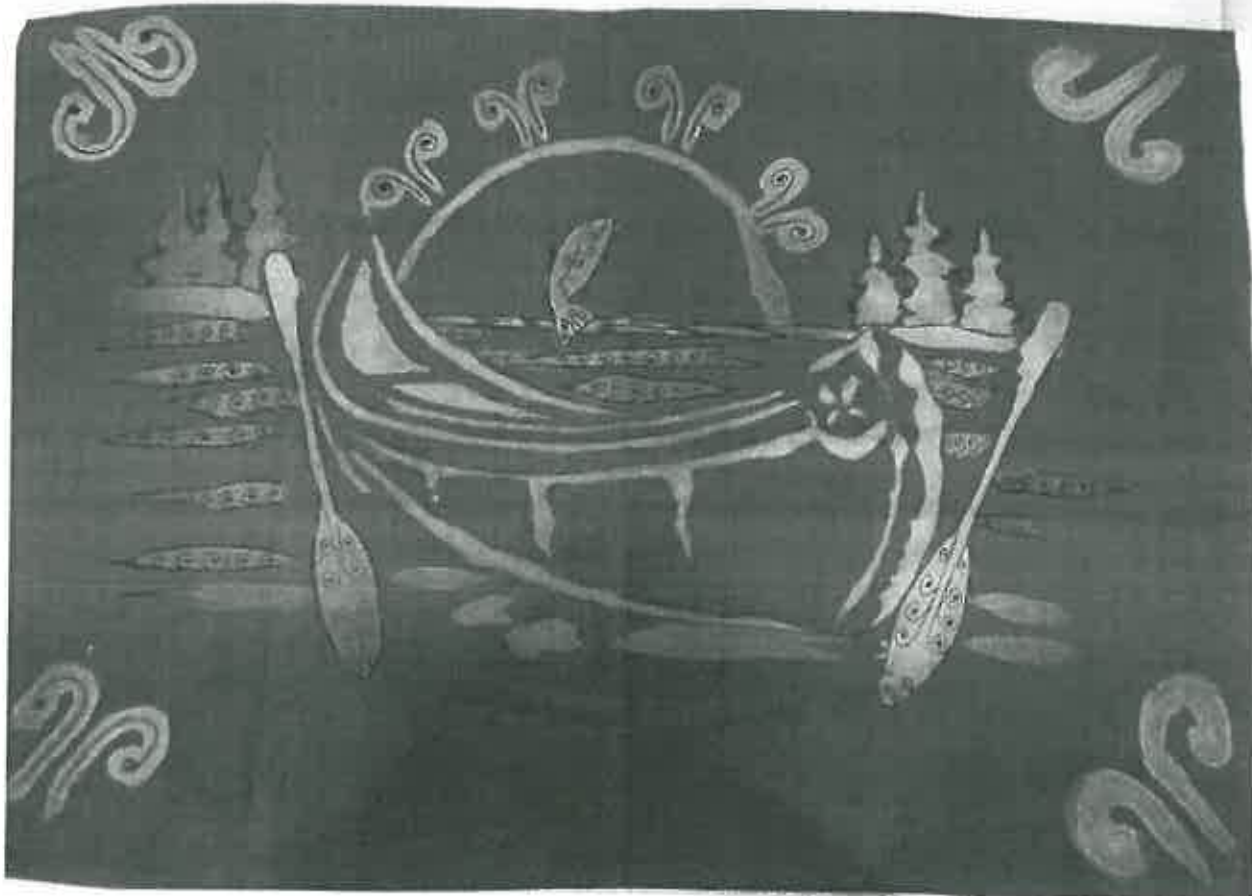
# MALISEET FLAG
