

Cutting/Thinning Technician Employment Opportunity

Recognizing the increased need for high quality archaeological assessment in New Brunswick, the Maliseet First Nation and the Government of New Brunswick (MFN/GNB) have create an initiative to prepare Maliseet First Nation individuals to participate in the assessment process. The first stage of this initiative is to undertake an archaeological large assessment of a proposed mining site in central New Brunswick by offering training and employment to Maliseet First Nation community members

The managing archaeological consultant is seeking to fill a number of positions within the archaeological field and support positions from First Nation communities. MFN/GNB is currently seeking candidates for Cutting /Thinning Technician (4 positions) for a term up to 12 week beginning August 2015.

Job Description:

Primary Role:

Under the supervision of the Cutting/Thinning Crew Chief, the role of the Cutting/Thinning Technicians is to operate handheld cutting and thinning equipment to clear areas and access trails designated archaeological test sites.

Key responsibilities:

- Caring for and maintaining handheld cutting and thinning equipment
- Strictly adhere to all safety policies, practices, and procedures
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- Necessary up to date certifications
- Practical experience in the safe operation of thinning saws and chainsaws
- Undertake physical labour in remote and difficult terrain in all weather conditions
- References required

- Field work starts August 31st, 2015
